### **Wine Grape Session - Vineyard to Winery**

10:15 – 10:45 – Misha Kwasniewski, Penn State University Associate Professor of Food Science

Dr. Kwasniewski's areas of expertise at Penn State include wine and fermented beverage production, distillation, flavor development, and chemical analysis. Misha will present on his research focusing on canopy management at bloom for optimal wine quality parameters.

10:50 – 11:20 – Chris Gerling, Sr. Extension Associate, Cornell AgriTech, Food Science

Chris's presentation will focus on Yeast Assimilated Nitrogen (YAN) and what we know about it. He will also touch base on Total Acid (TA), pH, phenolics and other qualities that help create the flavor profile in your wines.

Dr. Terry Bates will discuss his rootstock and wine grape trial. This work examined differing rootstock effects on vinifera viticultural measurements in the soil profiles in the Lake Erie Grape Region.

1:30 - 2:00 PM – Dr. Michela Centinari, Associate Professor of Viticulture, Penn State University

Michela will present on her research on threshold feeding of SLF on grapevines before viticultural parameters decrease.

2:05 - 2:35 PM – Brian Walsh, Penn State Extension

Brian's presentation will discuss management strategies learned over a decade of working with Spotted Lanternflies in vineyards. Grower stakeholders will learn strategies to be well prepared for when SLF begin to show up in our region such as Tree of Heaven (TOH) management or non-management, scouting techniques, pesticide fact sheets, and report on our preliminary SLF spray trial work. Stakeholders will walk away with practical tools.

2:40 – 3:10 PM – Dr. Katie Gold, Assistant Professor and Susan Eckert Lynch Faculty Fellow, School of Integrative Plant Science, Plant Pathology and Plant-Microbe Biology Section, Cornell AgriTech

Katie will give us an introduction into the work that her lab carries out and connect personally to our industry to listen to our needs and how we can direct research to continue sustainability into the future.

3:25 – 3:55 PM Jennifer Phillips Russo, Sr. Extension Associate, Cornell's Lake Erie Regional Grape Program  
Developing new cover cropping strategies tailored to Concord grapes is crucial. Jennifer will present this research that will not only benefit Concord growers directly but also has the potential to inform sustainable practices across other cultivars and agricultural commodities. This is a critical area of research, and its success could have far-reaching positive consequences. By systematically comparing different floor management strategies and measuring their effects on key parameters, this experiment can provide valuable insights into how to improve soil health, vine capacity, and economic sustainability in non-irrigated juice grape production.

4:00 – 4:30 PM – Megan Luke, Penn State University's Extension Educator in Viticulture and Small Fruits, Lake Erie Regional Grape Program

Megan will present on how Lake Erie Regional Grape Growers can remain confident in their pesticide application strategies and remain in compliance with changing pesticide label regulations. Megan will discuss best practices for record-keeping, including new Endangered Species Act mitigation measures and Bulletins, weather documentation, and equipment calibration. She will review the components of an IPM plan and discuss how recording day-to-day farm practices can aid growers during normal compliance checks.
