Tax Season

Tax season is upon us once again. For some growers income was higher than average and taxes will also be higher. Many growers have shown themselves to be quite adept in minimizing their tax burden through the timing of business expenses. Some strategies are better than others. Although it is more difficult for small business owners and growers, it remains important to plan ahead.

Cost of Grape Production

A key role of the business management educator has been to track the costs of production. To that end I would like to continue and expand on the farm cost survey. If you're interested in participating in the program please contact me. The participation of as many growers as possible is vital to the quality and reliability of the survey. Participation can also be valuable to obtain information and insight related to the performance of the farm. There is room for improvement in the farm cost survey. We will be looking to move beyond the schedule F, if participants are willing. If you'd like to participate please contact me.

2013 Tax Returns: Changes from Prior years

The first major change in tax policy was the American Taxpayer Relief Act of 2012. Some of those provisions will impact 2013 returns for the first time. Other major changes are a result of the Affordable Care Act. Most of the changes impact high income and net worth individuals only.

- Income Tax Marginal Rate Hike: The highest marginal income tax rate has been increased to 39.6%.
- Long-term Capital Gains: For those subject to this highest marginal rate, dividend and long-term capital gains increase from 15% to 20%.
- Net Investment Income Tax
 - o Applies if Modified Adjusted Gross Income (MAGI) is above \$200,000
 - o 3.8% of the lesser amount
 - MAGI less 200.000
 - Net Investment Income
 - Net Investment Income Includes
 - Gains from selling investment assets
 - Capital Gains distributions
 - Gross income and gains from passive business activities and rents
 - Gains from selling passive partnership interest
 - Gross income from trading financial instruments or commodities
 - o The tax does not apply to gains from business that you take an active roll in
 - 500 hours per year is always an active role
 - As few as 100 hours may qualify
 - o Roth IRAs will provide significant protection by reducing MAGI. Conversions, during the conversion year will increase MAGI
 - o The tax applies to estates and trusts as well
- Medicare Tax: .9% on FICA wages or self-employment income exceeding \$200,000
- Alternative Minimum Tax:
 - Indexed to inflation
 - o Phase-out of personal exemption and itemized deductions affect joint filers with adjusted gross incomes above \$300,000
