Weather: Here at the North East PA lab, we have accumulated 224 growing degree days during the first 10 days of July. Our gdd total since April 1 equals 1121. Our rainfall total for June was 6.87 inches and our July total is currently 0.91 inches. Aside from the potential for more rain tonight (July 11), the forecast for the next several days appears (*for the moment*) to look more on the dry, sunny side.

Phenology: Here by the lake we are closing in on 30 days past bloom (July 17 for us). Concord berries are averaging a little over 14 mm in diameter and are just under 1.5 grams per berry.

Diseases: At three and half weeks past bloom, Concord and Niagara fruit are resistant to <u>powdery</u> and <u>downy</u> <u>mildew</u>, and we now shift our attention to control of leaf infections for these two culprits. Keep in mind that Niagara cluster stems may remain susceptible to damage from downy mildew for a few weeks longer (though fruit are resistant), and downy mildew berry stem infections can lead to crop loss. We are seeing some downy and powdery mildew on leaves of unsprayed Concord and Niagara, but the incidence is still very low. Grower reports on crop estimation indicate we are dealing with a rather large to an extremely large crop. That means that maintaining canopies at optimum efficiency is a high priority and is cost effective. If you are applying additional sprays to keep leaves clean, keep in mind that canopies have bulked up dramatically since your last spray; shoot for best coverage (bump up your gallons per acre), especially if you are applying an eradicant like Nutrol or any of the potassium bicarbonates.

Scouting is still very important for diseases like <u>black rot</u>. We are nearing the end of the fruit susceptibility period, <u>but we are not there yet</u>. I am observing a disturbing level of black rot on leaves and fruit in unsprayed areas of our vineyard, where I haven't seen it in years, with or without mummies in the trellis. This indicates that 2013 has been a banner year for black rot, and any weaknesses in your black rot spray program are likely to manifest themselves in the form of crop loss. If you're not seeing any black rot developing, you're probably ok at this point. However, the sterol inhibitor fungicides (SI) are among the best materials for this disease, and will also provide additional control of powdery mildew on leaves (but no control of downy mildew). Mixing them with an eradicant will help to combat the development of resistance to the the SIs by the powdery mildew fungus. Other, more expensive materials like Vivando (powdery mildew only), will help maintain clean canopies for weeks to come. Again, the addition of an eradicant will help manage resistance.
