Details:	The Value-Added Producer Grant (VAPG) program helps U.S. agricultural producers enter into value-added activities that: <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Generate new products from raw agricultural commodities- Create and expand marketing opportunities- Increase producer income through enhanced product value and market reach These grants support either: <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Planning activities (e.g., feasibility studies, business and marketing plans)- Working capital needs (processing, packaging, advertising, inventory, and salaries)
Amount:	Planning Grants: Up to \$50,000 Working Capital Grants: Up to \$200,000 Matching Requirement: 1:1 match (100% of the grant amount), which may include cash or eligible in-kind contributions
For:	Agricultural producers (including harvesters and steering committees) Agricultural producer groups Farmer- or rancher-cooperatives
Availability:	Opens January 15, 2026 Program Application Period: Electronic applications will be accepted via the VAPG application portal until 1:00 p.m. Eastern Time on April 15, 2026.

Grant:	Environmental Quality Incentives Program

Details:	EQIP provides technical and financial assistance to agricultural producers and forest landowners to address natural resource concerns, such as: Improved water and air quality; Conserved ground and surface water; Increased soil health ; Reduced soil erosion and sedimentation; Improved or created wildlife habitat; and Mitigation against drought and increasing weather volatility.

Grant:	Assistance for Specialty Crop Farmers (ASCF) Program
State:	NY & PA
Funder:	Farm Service Agency
Details:	USDA's Farm Service Agency (FSA) is providing \$1 billion through a one-time bridge payment for specialty crops, sugar, and commodities not covered through the previously announced Farm Bridge Assistance (FBA) program. These bridge payments are authorized under the Commodity Credit Corporation Charter Act. ASCF payments are based on reported 2025 planted acres.
Amount:	End of March - commodity-specific payment rates will be released.
For:	Most specialty crops including grapes.
Availability:	Deadline to ensure 2025 crop acreage reports are factual and accurate for eligible ASCF crops.

Grant:	Round Two: NYS Beginning Farmer Competitive Grant Program
State:	NY
Funder:	NYS Department of Agriculture and Markets/The New York Farm Viability Institute
Details:	Farmers who have not operated a farm for more than 10 years and who will materially and substantially participate in operating the farm within the State are eligible to submit proposals. It is expected that all applicants will have a serious interest in building a financially sustainable, independent, commercial agricultural enterprise.
Amount:	\$5,000 - \$250,000
For:	Growers (Less than 10 years in business)
Availability:	NYFVI anticipates launching Round Two, which will award \$1.7 million early in 2026

Details:	If a farm or food system business is eligible for NYS G&C certification of a food and/or beverage product, they are eligible for this program. The NYS G&C program has worked hard to develop certification opportunities for a wide range of farms and food system businesses.
Amount:	Grant sizes will range from \$20,000 to \$250,000 for infrastructure and technology projects. A 10% match (cash, grant, loan) will be required for all projects

Grant:	NYS Food and Fiber Processing Grant Program
State:	NY
Funder:	New York State Department of Agriculture and Markets
Details:	The Food and Fiber Processing Grant Program, administered by the Farm and Food Growth Fund (FFGF) on behalf of the New York State Department of Agriculture and Markets, supports the scaling of existing and new products produced and harvested in New York State. Funding is available for the construction and renovation of facilities, as well as the purchase and installation of equipment. Priority will be given to projects that expand processing for fruits, vegetables, grains and beans for human consumption; plant and animal fibers.
Amount:	Eligible applicants may apply for awards ranging from \$250,000 to \$2.5 million.

Availability:	Application deadline: April 28, 2026, 5:00 pm EST

Details:	PA VinES (Vested in Environmental Sustainability) is a voluntary program that promotes sustainable viticulture practices through a grower self-assessment workbook. The workbook looks at the economic and environmental impacts of grape production on each operation and serves as an educational resource for growers.
Amount:	The PA VinES Program pays up to 85% of installing conservation practices like: Stream-bank Stabilization, Stabilized Access Roads, Stream Crossings/Culverts, Grassed Waterways, Blind Inlets/Drop Boxes, Riparian Buffers, Diversions, & Cover Crops

Grant:	Farm Vitality Planning Grant
State:	PA
Funder:	Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture
Details:	Grants may be used for expenses related to the following projects: - Creating or obtaining business plans or management strategies, plans for the transition of ownership and operation, plans to diversify an existing agricultural operation, plans for a farm expansion, or plans to maintain the long-term economic viability and protect the investment of public funds in preserving farms.
Amount:	The maximum grant amount is \$7,500 and is limited to 75% of project costs. This is a reimbursement grant. The amount of reimbursement is based on eligible costs submitted by an approved applicant for an approved project during the fiscal year in which the grant is offered. Grants will be awarded on a funds-available basis. In-kind support will not be counted toward an applicant's matching contribution.
